
Principal Hiring Debrief

March 15, 2023





- Timeline of events leading up to and following the naming of the principals at both Howard and Virginia Highland Elementary:
- First of all, this starts during the depth of the pandemic with the opening of Howard which was projected to happen in August 2020, which did not happen.
- In February 2021, Howard Middle opens at approx. 25% of students returning with Dr. Maxwell as the founding principal. This was a long time in the making with the school community working for about two years to get here.
- In May 2021, Dr. Maxwell is named the Asst.

- Superintendent for Innovation, Improvement and Redesign. It is important to note that around the same time, we had a change in cluster level leadership as well.
- In June 2021, Ms. Antone is named interim principal and in August, Howard opened its doors at full enrollment. It is important to remember that Covid was (and still is) a big concern and affected the way the community could interact with and in the school environment.
- In October 2021, the process of searching for a new principal for Howard began. All of the standard procedures were followed.
- By December, the search process yielded no viable candidates and the community was told the search would start over in early 2022. Ms. Antone had agreed to stay on through the end of the school year.
- The search resumed in early 2022
- On April 21, 2022, Janet McDowell was announced as the new principal of David T. Howard. Dr. Paula Snowden was brought in to help support Ms. Antone through the end of the school year.
- On May 31, 2022, after the official end of the school year, parents and staff were invited to meet Ms.
 McDowell for the first time since her naming as

- principal.
- Doors opened for the 2022-23 school year in August with a very new team at Howard Middle – 50% of the admin team was new that year.
- In September 2022, Ms. McDowell was let go from Howard and Dr. Snowden, Ms. Shea and Ms. Cappelli were all brought in to help and support.
- In October 2022, after one failed search and the release of a new principal just one month after school opens, the process starts again for finding a new principal.
- In December 2022, Ms. Hollis, who previously served in leadership is announced as the new principal of Howard and starts in January 2023.
- Concurrently, the process to identify a principal for the new Virginia Highland Elementary was happening. The process began in August 2022 and moved quickly with a candidate named for approval in September 2022.
- After concerns arose around information shared during the process, the offer to the candidate was rescinded.



She is a former special education teacher who previously served as the Parent Liaison at Hope-Hill Elementary.




A principal can influence the culture of the school's community for teachers, parents, and students.






Second Question
